FRIDAY, JUNE 21 AT 7PM STONEWALL AT 50: GAY LIBERATION IN THE US & GERMANY

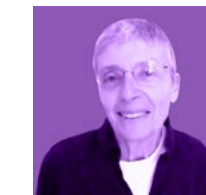

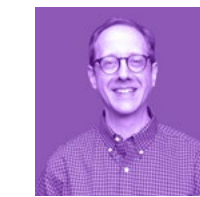


Ellen Broidy was an early member of the Gay Liberation Front and part of the Come Out cell. She was "president" of the NYU Student Homophile League, a founder of Radicalesbians, and, in fall 1969, presented the resolution creating the Christopher Street Liberation Day March at the Eastern Regional Conference of Homophile Organizations. Ellen completed her doctorate in U.S. Women's History at the University of California, Irvine. She, along with her partner of 40 years, remains active in progressive causes. *Photo by Joan Ariel.*



Patrick Henze completed his Ph.D. in Gender Studies on the topic of the West German gay movement in the 1970s and currently works at the International Psychoanalytic University Berlin. Also known by his alias Patsy l'Amour laLove, he lives as an organizer, author, and "Tunte" (political drag queen) in Berlin. 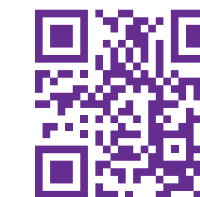
